Stillness

The change from summer to cool autumn is not that easy for many people. You swap shirts and light jackets for sweaters and warm coats. Although you can't stop the seasons changing, it's not a reason for drabness. We are pausing for a moment to catch our breath, because A/W 2020 is all about reduction and minimalism. The trends are characterized by a dual perspective on the future located somewhere between ecological sustainability and technological vision. The inspirations come from nature. A return to robust and natural materials and intricate craftsmanship characterises the new definition of fashion. A combination of appealing colours such as warm reds and vibrant yellows, which emphasise the fusion of cultural diversity, and soft fabrics and outlines that express a desire for equality. Cuts are becoming wider and more comfortable, creating a discreet sexiness. Rich pop-up colours loosen up masculine casualness. Visual impressions are created by expressive and artistic prints, while structured surfaces, interesting details and distinctive cuts are guaranteed to appeal to the sense of touch. The mix of different patterns creates a refreshing contrast, and layering makes an innovative, airy and subtle impression. The focus will be on less and better as well as on sustainable and intuitive, and the result will be a feeling of liberation and lightness.



THE MATERIALS

- Softly falling fabrics such as silk, viscose and Tencel are now extending into autumn. They follow the shape of the body gently like a second skin and thus emphasize the feminine form. Perfect as a combination with coarse knitwear.
- Hardly ever have wool and knitwear been this chic. From fine to coarse knits and unusual patterns – wool can never be too cosy and has become a real statement.
- Cotton jerseys, muslin and sweats are soft and easy to work with. These ultra-modern all-rounders can be used to create classically elegant or sporty and comfortable designs.
- Tactile fabrics stimulate the senses. A special feel attracts attention, whether it's jacquard, bouclé, waffle piqué, velvet, merino, cashmere or satin and silk crepe. They impress with coarse weaves, a shimmering finish or a nodular structure that invites you to touch them.

THE CUTS

- Certain clothes are a must this winter. Belts, elastic cords and dividing seams promise a beautiful waistline, whether for the timeless sheath dress, extra-wide outlines or the A-line.
- Skirts could not be more varied. The range covers everything from the pencil skirt, through the wide curved frock, to the casual midi skirt in knitwear or jersey.
- Trousers remain classic and comfortable. Materials, designs and wide cuts tend to provide the variety here.
- Simple and comfortable is also the name of the game when it comes to blouses and shirts, but they stand out with sophisticated details – a beautiful back can look charming, too.
- There is also a special focus on jackets and coats. They have unusual collar variations, oversize cuts, padding and accentuated waistlines with a wrap-around look.





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
Mother Earth

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

THE PATTERNS
